The project is in the Lekwa Local Municipality and Dipaleseng Local Municipality area within the Gert Sibande District Municipality in the province of Mpumalanga.

On behalf of the South African National Roads Agency. This project is in the province of the Mpumalanga and in the Gert Sibande District Municipality.

Preferences are offered to prospective tenderers from the targeted area, namely the **Lekwa Local Municipalities** and **Dipaleseng Local Municipality**, as well as the CIDB grades and classes indicated for each sub-contract package. This tender will be evaluated in terms of functionality criteria and the price and preference points system. Tenderers who satisfy the following criteria are eligible to submit tenders:

- a) Valid B-BBEE Level 1 or 2 contributor.
- b) Exempted Micro Enterprise (EME)
- c) Registered on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD).
- d) Registered as "active" with the Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) in the relevant contractor grade and class designation.
- e) CIPC Document.

An award will only be made to the RFQ Noticer with the highest evaluation points that are:

- f) Compliant with the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act (COIDA); and
- g) Tax Clearance certificate.

Submissions: All required compliance documentation with BOQ should be hard copy.

Note to subcontractors:

- VEA Road Maintenance and Civils will reserve the right to negotiate feasible rates with the appointed subcontractor if necessary.
- Subcontractors must specify the company's address, CIDB Grade and the Package that they are interested in.
- The conditions of the Sub-Contract are based on the 1999 Version of FIDIC Conditions of Contract for Construction for Building and Engineering Works Designed by the Employer, together with the Particular Conditions of the Main Contract
- Please note that the contract duration is estimated to be 4 months strictly accordingly to the available budget, the client can at any given time give a months' notice for the contracts to be ended before the 4 month period elapses.
- Vegetation control will strictly be on instruction of the engineer, and will not be a monthly item.

Stage 1 – Functionality

Note that no Targeted Enterprise may be prohibited from responding to the invitation to tender, however, preference shall be given to those Targeted Enterprises that adheres to the Targeted Enterprise Database criteria by means of a functionality evaluation. For this reason, “locality” and “CIDB grading and class” forms part of the functionality criteria and the biggest weighting shall be attached to these two criteria.

Functionality is based on the following criteria:

- Locality (Target Areas)
- CIDB grade and class (Targeted only)
- Targeted Groups

Tenderers must score a minimum number of points for functionality, e.g., 75/100 and tenderers that do not obtain the threshold are not further evaluated. The minimum number of points or threshold shall be decided by the PMT in consultation with the PLC and may vary depending on the subcontracting Works or any other valid considerations.

Tenders are required to obtain a minimum threshold of **75/100** to be considered for Stage 2, Price and Preference.

Stage 2 - Price & Preference

Tenderers who obtained the minimum threshold for functionality will be evaluated on their Price and Preference submissions, i.e.

- i. Price = 80%
- ii. Preference = 20%

Price

A is the number calculated using the formula:

$$A = (1 - (P - P_m) / P_m) \times 80$$

Where:

P is the comparative offer of the tender offer under consideration, and

P_m is the comparative offer of the most favorable comparative offer (lowest tender offer carried forward from stage 1)

In the event that the calculated value is negative, the allocated score shall be 0 (zero).

Preference

Points are based on a tenderer's B-BBEE status level of contributor measured in terms of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act (B-BBEE, Act 53 of 2003), as amended and will be allocated according to the Preferential Procurement Regulations (2017) to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA, Act 5 of 2000).

Points awarded will be according to a tenderer's B-BBEE status level of contributor and summarized in the table below:

The highest-scoring tenderer for each subcontract package shall be checked for eligibility. The Contractor shall state in the tender advertisement and in the tender documents that only one subcontract package shall be awarded to an individual entity at any one time, meaning that a Targeted Enterprise may be awarded a work package and, on conclusion thereof may be awarded a subsequent work package, but more than one work package may not be awarded simultaneously.

If a tenderer tendered for more than one subcontract package and scored the highest points in more than one package, the Contractor shall award to the tenderer the work package that has the most economic benefit to the Employer.

Stage 3 – Eligibility Check.

The final stage of the tender evaluation is the eligibility evaluation. Only the preferred tenderers for each subcontract package will be engaged, should any documentation verification and/or re- submission.

The highest scoring tenderer for each subcontract package will be evaluated for eligibility based on the following criteria:

- Proof of the Tenderer's B-BBEE contributor level.
- Proof of the Tenderer's CIPC document.
- Proof that the Tenderer is an EME or QSE entity.
- Proof that the Tenderer is registered on National Treasury's CSD.
- Proof that the Tenderer is compliant with the COID act.
- Proof that the Tenderer is tax compliant.
- Proof that the Tenderer is registered with the CIDB in the required grading and class(not applicable to suppliers).

The tender evaluation will be undertaken for a period of one weeks and further allowance has been made for engaging with the project management team (PMT) for the approval of the evaluation and the presentation of the tender evaluation report to the PLO. The anticipated commencement date of the subcontracts is **12 August 2026**.
